Steven Whyte will be creating a sculpture - Live - in Devendorf Park

Daily Visit often

Steven Whyte Bio

Born in England, Steven Whyte attended the prestigious Sir Henry Dalton School of Sculpture and before graduation Whyte had begun his career in portrait sculpture.

He attracted the attention of members of Britain's political, cultural and business spheres, and commissioned by a major European hotel chain during the final year of his studies

Whyte became the youngest member of the London based Society of Portrait Sculptors, honoring the most celebrated figurative sculptors in Europe.

Numerous commissions for public monuments followed. Throughout the creation process behind these larger works Whyte combined this sense of duty with his creativity.

In The Silverdale Mining Memorial, he honored the fatalities of the town's mining disasters by creating a permanent testament to the struggle and heroism common to the workers' daily lives. With the Jack Baskeyfield VC Tribute, Whyte designed a piece that depicts the physical details of a specific World War II soldier while it expresses the universal bravery and sacrifice in battle.

The artist's tribute to the fire and rescue workers on the 50th anniversary of Staffordshire Fire Brigade was again inspired by heroism in daily life.

Relocation to the United States

Whyte established an open studio and gallery in Carmel, California in 2007. The gallery has been featured on CNN's My City My Secret, in The San Francisco Chronicle and in The New York Times' celebrated 36 Hours column and book.

With a growing list of private collectors, Whyte continued to create work for the public sphere. His first major monument in the United States was the exceedingly popular National Salute to Bob Hope and the Military. Featuring the central figure of Bob Hope, surrounded by service men and women, all historically accurate from different wars and branches of the military Hope


entertained as part of the USO. He sculpted a prototype of Bob Hope for this Sculpture, in Devendorf Park during the Carmel Art Festival. Whyte followed his work for San Diego with two monuments to Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Working with photojournalist Bob Finch who covered King during his time at the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, The first monument is housed at the Fontana Lewis Library & Technology Center's Children's Reading Room. The monument features a heroic bust of King atop a column rendered to represent the key books King had referenced in his own work. Whyte was then chosen by Hollywood, Florida to produce a 1.5 time life size portrait bust of Dr. Martin Luther King. The bust was installed on top of a carved granite slab on which the "I Have a Dream" speech was carved. A prototype for this sculpture was also created live in Devendorf Park during the Carmel Art Festival.

Whyte also created a new piece of sculpture for his own community of Carmel for California's historic Mission San Carlos Borromeo - a new high-bas relief of St. Anthony and the Young Christ Child for the Mission's Chapel.

He then produced new portraits of U.S. presidents, beginning with founding fathers. Whyte's representations of Lincoln, Jefferson and others have become sought after for additions to the collections of some of the nation's most influential leaders, including former Secretary of Defense Leon E. Panetta. Whyte expanded his range to include athleticism when he was commissioned to create a thirteen-foot monument of Heisman Trophy winner John David Crow for Texas A&M University. The completed monument is now a focal point at A&M's Kyle Field. And again he began the process in Devendorf Park during the Carmel Art Festival. Recently, Whyte won a second commission with Texas A & M for a monument to the tradition of their ferociously dedicated student fans, referred to as the "12th Man." The War Hymn Memorial is a 1.6 times life size monument in which twelve A&M students are linking shoulders and feet in the midst of their War Hymn cheer. The artist followed with another installation for San Diego, this time honoring fallen members of the county's sheriff's department. The Law Enforcement Memorial depicts a scene in which a San Diego sheriff presents a flag to the family of a fallen comrade.

In addition to the War Hymn Monument, the year 2014 also unveiled Whyte's replica of a life size African elephant for Tuft's University in Medford, Massachusetts. The elephant represents the university's mascot, Jumbo. The 5,000-pound monument is nearly twelve feet high and 19 feet long. Whyte's largest contribution to the California landscape is Cannery Row Monument. Whyte has created an expansive work of public art for Monterey's Cannery Row Company. The monument is erected in historic Steinbeck Plaza. Featuring nine life-size characters from John Steinbeck's Cannery Row, the scene includes the Nobel and Pulitzer Prize winning author himself, now forever memorialized in a place that became a constant character in his works of fiction. The new installation is the largest public monument between San Francisco and Los Angeles.

He was selected as the 2016 Sports Artist of the Year, by the United States Sports Academy and the American Sport Art Museum & Archives and his bronze bust of Congressman John Conyers, Jr. (Michigan) was selected to be featured in the National Portrait Gallery's Permanent Collection in The Smithsonian Institute.

What is Plein Air?

Plein Air refers to a style of painting that became popular in the mid-19th century and was advocated by the French impressionists such as Claude Monet and Pierre-Auguste Renoir. Plein Air painting is done outdoors in one sitting and the subject is the scene before the artist. The invention of tube paint and the box easel that carries paints and brushes and folds to be easily transported, led to the popularity of this art form.

Why in Carmel?

Frank Hubbard Powers, a San Francisco attorney and his wife Jane Gallatin Powers, an artist, were two of the founders of Carmel along with James Frank Devendorf. By 1901 they had bought up more than three fourths of what is now Carmel-by-the-Sea. She was the first Plein Air painter here, as well as a studio painter, and she was a strong advocate for the arts. Jane and Frank convinced many of their artist friends left homeless by the 1906 San Francisco earthquake to move to Carmel. By 1910 the San Francisco Call reported that 60% of Carmel's houses were built by citizens who were devoting their lives to work connected to the aesthetic arts. We are proud to have one of Jane Powers great-great-grandchildren as a frequent participant in our Plein Air competition.


